Sec. 46-1. Disorderly conduct.

(a) No person shall within the city engage in any disorderly conduct. Whoever does, incites or encourages any of the following in a public or private place, knowing, or having reasonable grounds to know that it will, or will tend to, alarm, anger or disturb others or provoke an assault or breach of the peace, has committed disorderly conduct:

(1) Engages in brawling or fighting.

(2) Disturbs an assembly or meeting not unlawful in its character.

(3) Engages in offensive, obscene, abusive, boisterous or noisy conduct or in offensive, obscene or abusive language tending reasonably to arouse alarm, anger or resentment in others.

(b) A person does not violate this section if the person's disorderly conduct was caused by an epileptic seizure.

Sec. 46-2. Blocking pedestrians.

No person shall stand, or congregate with others, upon the sidewalks or crosswalks of the city in such a manner as to interfere with pedestrian traffic.

No person shall beg within the city.

Sec. 46-4. Curfew.

No person under the age of 17 shall be on any public street, alley or grounds in the city between 10:30 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. No person of the age of 17 shall be on any public street, alley or grounds in the city between 12:00 midnight and 6:00 a.m. The above shall not apply to any such person accompanied by and under the control of another person of lawful age, with the consent of his parent or legal guardian; or upon an errand by permission of his parent, legal guardian or employer. No such person permitted to be upon the public

streets, alleys or grounds shall loiter or make any undue noise. Upon a first arrest for violating this section the person arrested shall be taken and delivered into the custody of his parent, guardian or employer. Upon every subsequent arrest the person arrested shall be subject to the penalty provided for violations of this chapter.

Sec. 46-5. Discharging firearms.

No person shall discharge any firearm of any description within the city. This section does not apply to activity by police, firefighters or other appropriate governmental officials when such activity is part of their official duties.

Sec. 46-6. Sling shots, air rifles.

No person shall use or discharge any sling shot, air rifle or similar device within the city.

Sec. 46-7. Trespass.

Whoever intentionally occupies or enters a building or dwelling of another, without claim of right or the consent of the owner or the consent of one who has the right to give consent, except in an emergency situation, is guilty of a misdemeanor.

Sec. 46-8. Rubbish burning.

No person shall burn rubbish within the fire limits described in section 14-51, excluding blocks 22, 23 and 24.
